Parenting is improving; relationships are improving; confidence in evangelizing is improving; knowing the right verses for the situation is improving. Folks are evangelizing and ministering to relatives; they are testifying to clients; they are witnessing to neighbors. The three young girls have started taking piano lessons with Victoria. Dylan has been working for 5+ months as a block/rock mason. These are great things. I thank the Lord for our people's desires and direction. The Lord is at work, and we have seen many good decisions in the last couple of months. Praise God!

I get excited when I think of Christ's masterful plan for ministry in the church—perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ. This is discipleship. Spiritual growth takes time, but the Lord is faithful. He is at work, and He has a plan to use His people in ministry for His glory. He redeemed us, and He sanctifies us. What a God we serve! He never leaves His own. I was talking to one of our ladies a few weeks ago. She has gone through many difficult stretches in her life, and she said, "The Lord has never left me." How wonderful and comforting!
